

# TIMELINE OF SELECTED HISTORICAL EVENTS

# BEFORE EVENTS OF THE PLAY

**1917-1919:** After World War I, British occupy Palestine, declare intention to make it a Jewish homeland, start facilitating the immigration of European Jewish population.

Non-Jewish population of Palestine reacts against this plan. Strikes, protests, riots, escalating into armed violence with deaths on both sides.

1931: founding of Irgun, Jewish underground group

1936-39: Arab General Strike and Revolt

# **DURING EVENTS OF THE PLAY**

1942: Allied victory against Rommel in Egypt.

1946: July 22: King David Hotel blown up by Irgun.

**1947:** Nov. 29: UN General Assembly suggests partition of Palestine into

Jewish and Arab states.

Dec, 18: first Palestinian village, Khissas, attacked by Zionist forces.

1948: By May, several hundred thousand Palestinians expelled

from Palestine.

May 14/15: British withdraw from Palestine. Zionist forces declare the State of Israel. Jordan, Egypt, Syria declare war on Israel.

# AFTER EVENTS OF THE PLAY

**1949:** January-July: cease-fires and armistices with Egypt, Jordan, Syria. Israel takes control of larger area than suggested in Partition Plan.

Jordan takes control of the West Bank

Egypt takes control of Gaza.

500 Palestinian villages destroyed.

800,000 Palestinians driven out of Palestine.

Refugees prevented from return by Israeli forces.

1967: Israel conquers West Bank, Gaza, Golan Heights

West Bank and Gaza are held under military occupation, but some movement allowed between Occupied Territories and Israel.

1970: [In the play, Noor returns to the village.]

Off-Broadway: Edmund in *The Rat Trap* (Mint Theatre). Regional: Richard Dreyfuss in Bruce *The Musical* (Seattle Rep). A recent graduate of The Juilliard School's Drama Division.

Khalifa Natour (Zakareeya and Dramaturgy) is a Palestinian actor born in Qalansawa and graduated from Beit Zvi- School of Acting. He has adapted and performed in productions directed by Amir Nizar Zuabi including: Stories under Occupation (AlKasaba Theater, Ramallah), Jidarriya (Al-Hakawati Theater, Jerusalem), which toured to: Bouffes Du Nord, Young Vic, Royal Court, Edinburgh Festival and more. Natour won first prize for best actor in the Jaffa Festival (2006) for In Spitting Distance, directed by Ofira Henig (The Barbican, Romaeuropa Festival, Theaterspektakel, Sydney Opera, Schaubuhne Theater, Bouffes Du Nord and more). He worked with Peter Brook on Fragments and 11 and 12. He starred in Zuabi's Grey Rock produced by Remote Theater Project (La MaMa, The Public, Guthrie Theatre and Kennedy Center). Film credits include: The Band's Visit, Le File de l'autre, Tikkun and more.

Haythem Noor (Grandpa), a New York native born in Cairo, Egypt, holds a Bachelor of Arts degree in Economics from the City University of New York. He honed his acting skills by studying the Meisner technique under William Esper at Esper Studio. Notable achievements include starring in the Broadway national tour of *The Kite Runner* and appearing in various TV shows such as Ramy, Homeland, Madam Secretary, Law & Order, Without a Trace, Third Watch, and Law & Order: Special Victims Unit. Moreover, his performance in Misha Schulman's play Desert Sunrise was lauded by The New York Times as 'haunting and caustic'. Noor firmly believes in living by the mantra, "The artist can work

any job there is, but only for a short while. Only artistic jobs can fulfill us, so we must hold on to them until the end." He is excited to be a part of thi production of *The Mulberry Tree*.

Najla Said (Salma/Mother) Favorite credits include: *Nine Parts of Desire* (Seattle Rep), *A World I Loved* (NYC, UK, Beirut) with Vanessa Redgrave, and *The Fever Chart* (Central Square Theatre). Najla performed her solo show, *Palestine*, Off-Broadway (Twilight/NYTW) in 2010, as well as at over 50 colleges, high schools, institutions and events all over the world. In 2013 she published a memoir (*Looking For Palestine: Growing Up Confused in an Arab-American Family*) based on her play, that is currently a part of many school curriculums. In 2010 she was named one of the Forty Feminists Over Forty by The Feminist Press. Najla has written two librettos which have been performed at Carnegie Hall and all over Europe, notably at the BBC Proms and Salzburg Festival. Recent TV and Film credits include: *NCIS: New Orleans, New Amsterdam* (NBC), *Feud* (FX), and her voice is currently featured in two animated films: *The Tower* (dir. Mats Grorud) and *My Love Affair With Marriage* (dir: Signe Baumane)

Laith Zuaiter (Yitzhak/Tofeek) is a Palestinian-American actor, writer and producer from Brooklyn, NY. Film/TV Credits: M.O.N.Y. (Dir. Spike Lee, 2007, NBC), RAMY (2019, HULU/A24), Lovesick in the Westbank (2022). Theater Credits: Humayun in Guards at the Taj (LA, 2019), Andrey in Three Sisters (The Actors Studio, 23'.) Hanna Eady and Edward Mast (Playwrights) have been writing plays together since they met in Seattle in 1995. Hanna Eady grew up as a Palestinian in what is now Israel. He came to Seattle for graduate school in directing, and he continues to return home to work with different Palestinian theatre companies, including the one he founded in his native village Buqayah, where he wrote his first play, *Art and Politics*. Edward Mast's plays have been performed in several cities and countries, and he was returning home from his first of many trips to the Occupied Palestinian West Bank when he met Hanna Eady. Their first collaboration was *Sahmatah*, a play drawn from testimonies by residents of one of the Palestinian villages destroyed during the founding of Israel in 1948. Other plays they have written together include *Loved Ones: Families of the Incarcerated*, *Letters from Palestine in the Time of the Virus*, and *The Love Tunnel: A Comedy of Occupation*. Their play *The Return* premiered in a Hebrew-language production in *Haifa*, and just completed an extended run in Seattle by Dunya Productions.

Habib Shehadeh Hanna (Composer) is a renowned Palestinian musician, award-winning composer, and a song writer. Habib mastered the Arabic Oud from a young age, and also studied Western musicology and composition. He has synthesized his many musical influences to compose genre defying material for a vast range of influential projects. As a song writer working with Palestinian and Arab household names, and composer for many critically acclaimed film and theatre projects, and several albums, including Mahmoud Darweesh's masterpiece work of poetry The Mural, his music has touched audiences at prestigious festivals and events in Europe, the Middle East, Japan, Australia USA and across the world. Habib worked on many music collaboration with musicians from Europe, Africa, North America and Asia. Having written his first play under curfew during the second intifada, for Hanna, music and creativity are powerful expressions of cultural identity in the face of continuous erasure and occupation. He has used his growing influence as a lyricist, composer and performer to improve the access to and the teaching of music to.

Alexandra Aron (Director) is the Founder and Producing Artistic Director of the Remote Theater Project, bringing theater artists from different cultural backgrounds to create new work (www.remotetheaterproject.com). A New York-based director highlights include Leslie Epstein's King of the Jews at HERE Arts, A Night in the Old Marketplace (Frank London/Glen Berger) at MASS MoCA São Paulo, Copenhagen, Warsaw, Toronto, Milan, New York City, Naked Old Man by Murray Schisgal, starring David Margulies (Ensemble Studio Theatre); Imagining Madoff by Deb Margolin (Theater J, DC); Three Seconds in the Key by Deb Margolin (New Georges, NYC). Salomé: Woman of Valor, Adeena Karasick/Frank London (Vancouver, Toronto, ART's Oberon Theater). She directed the short film Two Altars and a Cave starring Lois Smith. Alex has developed several plays with Palestinian and Jewish theater artists. She commissioned and produced Grey Rock by Amir Nizar Zuabi at La MaMa, also seen at the Melbourne and Adelaide Festivals, Kennedy Center, and Guthrie Theater Under the Radar Festival. Alex co-created and produced Lines an international collaboration with Fidaa Zidan (Palestine), John Rwothomack (Uganda/UK), and Junaid Sarieddeen (Lebanon) at the Sheffield Theatre, UK, and at La MaMa Theatre in April 2024. She is an affiliated artist of New Georges Theater, an alum of LCT Directing Lab & Women's Project Lab, a Fulbright scholar to Argentina, and a graduate of Wesleyan University. www.alexandraaron.com

John Breen (Producer) is best known as the writer/director of the hit play Alone it Stands, which tells the story of Munster's victory over the All Blacks in 1978. John was awarded the Irish Times/ESB Theatre Award in February 2000 for Best Director for his direction of his own play Alone it Stands. Alone it Stands has been seen all over Ireland, the UK, Australia, the United States, France, Malaysia, New Zealand and Tasmania It is estimated that two hundred

and sixty thousand people worldwide have seen the play. In New York, he recently produced *King of The Jews* by Leslie Epstein, directed by Alexandra Aron, at HERE Arts. Following a career as an Artistic Director of several companies in Ireland, John moved to New York in 2014 with his family. He is the General Manager of Loose Change Productions and Magis Theatre. With Loose Change Productions, he produced *Export Quality* by Dorotea Mendoza, Erica Miguel and Carolyn Antonio at HERE Arts, directed by Sonoko Kawahara. He has adapted *The Quiet Man* by Maurice Walsh (upon which John Ford's film was based) for the stage with Mikel Murfi, and they will direct the world premiere at the Dublin Theatre Festival next year.


