Director's notes:

I thought I knew what melodrama was. I had seen bad melodrama. But then my eyes were opened by Philippe Gaulier, the famous clown teacher of Simon McBurney, Emma Thompson, Sacha Baron Cohen, and Helena Bonham Carter, to name a few. Studying with Philippe and with Gregor Paslawsky opened a world of seeing it from the point of view of the people of the 19th century who needed something to hope for. "The people of Paris" were at the forefront. People who worked long hours and earned barely enough to survive. People who had their deep feelings cancelled by the grind of the Industrial Revolution. People who wanted to feel something more than their own exhaustion.

Fast forward to David Cale, a performer whose work is part of La MaMa's history and who participated in the re-opening of this performance space in 2023. He performed a monologue that quoted Joe Chaikin and left me with a mantra that continues to inspire me: "to express the extreme joy of being alive at a certain moment is practically impossible and really worth trying."

I realized that this is what real melodrama is trying to do. And I wanted to try.

Henry Siddons' book A Practical Guide to Rhetorical Gestures, first published in London in 1822, examined the deep feelings of the literature of the Romantic period. He gets into the minutia of the gestures and stances that were translated from Romantic paintings to the stage by the performers of his own time. He mediated and mused on where these feelings come from, how they live in the body, and how seeing them embodied on stage can open that place in the heart of the audience.

Tonight, we invite you to get into a "time machine" and go back to a time when people's hearts were not so different from what we are going through today. And after all, it was the matters of the heart that led Ellen Stewart to create La MaMa, and the hearts on the facade of this building that led her to choose this as a home, even though some of those hearts might be upside down.

Desire brought Magis Theatre Company into being: desire to train, desire to teach, desire to act. Several alumni from the Columbia University MFA program in Acting wanted to deepen and develop their training. Recognizing that there was not yet any single place to go where they could continue to find the diversity and breadth of the techniques they had been learning, they decided to work together to create a laboratory where different techniques could be investigated and interact with one another. In 2003 artistic director George Drance partnered with Notre Dame School of Manhattan. Working with the students to form a theatre program in exchange for rehearsal space in the girl's high school on 13th Street, Magis has opened its doors to student and professional actors seeking this kind of training for over twenty years, and has presented at New York State Theatre Educators Association, The Educational Theatre Association, The Austrian Voice Institute, and the Voice Foundation Symposium and in workshops at educational institutions such as Fordham University, Boston College, Marquette University, and Creighton University; with the Kennedy Center's Cultural Visitors Program; Magis techniques also form part of the training regimen for La MaMa's Trojan Women Project. Past Productions include "The Alcestiad" (2021), "Miracle in Rwanda" (2019), Calderon's Two Dreams (2017),*mark (2015, 2023 and 2024) Occupy Olympus (2013) "Shakuntala and the Ring of Recognition". (2010), "Her name is Vincent". (2009), "The Great Divorce" (2007). Magis Theatre Company is now a part of the newly created Magis Arts Collective expanding its work to provide programming in schools, prisons, and with community partners in the US and worldwide.



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
