Ellen Stewart Theatre 66 East 4th Street, NYC, 10003 May 16-June 1, 2025 Kon, a director at the Moscow Art Theatre, stages a bold, free-spirited production of Chekhov's *The Seagull*—until Russia's 2022 invasion of Ukraine casts a shadow of censorship. His once vibrant reimagining, rooted in freedom, is reduced to an empty shell of his vision. Determined to save his play, Kon flees to New York, hoping to bring his true vision to life. But the American dream proves cold. His important and symbolic theater production finds little welcome, and he faces loss and rejection. Like Treplev, he teeters on the brink of suicide but refuses to give up. Torn between his Russian roots and an elusive American paradise, Kon must redefine himself as an artist and survive. Inspired by real events.

CREATIVES

Alexander Molochnikov is a theater director, writer and filmmaker. He worked for over ten years in Moscow where he directed five major productions in drama, a ballet, an opera, two feature films and a TV show. In 2022, he spoke out against the Russian military invasion of Ukraine and then moved to New York. He is now unable to return home to Russia. Since 2014, his first play, 19.14 Cabaret, an antiwar manifest about World War One has been running in repertoire for over ten years at the Moscow Art Theatre of Chekov. However, the theater has removed his name from all materials. The billing now says "Directed by Director". Alexander's opera The Telephone. Medium by Gian Carlo Menotti premiered at the Bolshoi Theatre, along with his ballet The Seagull, which was honored with the "Golden Mask" (the Russian equivalent of the Tony Awards) for best ballet of the year. His feature film, Tell Her, about moving to the U.S. as a child premiered in 2020 at the 47th SIFF. He has created and directed over ten shows and films in Moscow together with the most viewed six-episode TV series Monastery in 2022. He premiered Crime and Punishment show at the Tel Aviv Gesher theatre in December 2024. He is working now on a feature film related to the novel. His short film Extremist is long-listed for Bafta 2025 awards.

Eli Rarey is an independent filmmaker, playwright, performance artist and poet. His feature film *The Famous Joe Project*, premiered at Outfest in 2012. Rarey was a founding member of SCIENCE PROJECT performance collective and has written, directed and performed on stage with Planet Ant Theater in Detroit. He holds a bachelor's degree from Columbia University in Theater Arts and an MFA degree from USC School of Cinematic Arts, where he later taught in the Interactive Media Division. He is overwhelmed with gratitude to be part of the creative team bringing this unique play to life.

Sandro Gurdzhua is a multidisciplinary artist and arts administrator with a background in acting, filmmaking, music, and photography. Currently serving as the sound operator and administrative assistant on this production, he has been involved in its development for nearly two years, supporting both its creative and administrative growth. Sandro recently earned his Master's degree in Arts Administration. He is passionate about collaborative storytelling and is excited to continue learning from—and contributing to—the vibrant world of theater.

Diego Las Heras is a Canadian/Chilean composer, sound designer, and music technologist based in New York City. He is currently a faculty member at New York University's Music Technology department. His sound design work has been featured in productions by a range of theater companies across New York City. He holds degrees in Arranging & Composition (Escuela Moderna de Música, Chile), Jazz Studies (B.A., Humber College, Canada), and Music Technology (M.M., NYU). His music has appeared in films, television, video games, and documentaries internationally. As a sound artist and electronic music performer, Diego has been invited to participate in several art venues and galleries including the Artist Space (ISP/Whitney Museum), Kunstfestspiele Herrenhausen (Hannover, Germany), Region(es): SUD Festival (NYC), Flux Factory (NYC), Synesthesia (NYC), Santiago Museum of Contemporary Art, and the National Archives of Chile.

Fedor Zhuravlev is a composer, multi-instrumentalist, sound designer, and producer. Born in Moscow, he has been working in the USA since 2023. Fedor is the author of an original methodology for creating and performing music. His sound is shaped at the intersection of classical music, contemporary sonic forms, and cutting-edge music technologies. Fedor works in genres such as prog-rock, jazz, blues, classical, avantgarde, experimental, electronic, ambient, minimalist, and pop music. He composes for theater, film, television, and advertising, using his proficiency in various instruments: guitar, piano, drums, while actively applying modern sound production and synthesis technologies. Characterized by emotional expressiveness, a keen sense of rhythm, and a deep commitment to enhancing the dramaturgy of each project, Fedor's style creates a unique musical and sonic space. Among his works are: The Tale of the Last Angel (Theater of Nations, Moscow, directed by Andrey Moguchiy), Jean and Beatrice (Tabernacle Theatre, London, directed by Dmitry Serdyuk), The Dybbuk (Arlekin Players Theatre, Boston, directed by Igor Golyak), The Merchant of Venice (Classic Stage Company, New York, directed by Igor Golyak), as well as the films Tsoi (directed by Alexey Uchitel) and Intensive Care (directed by Peter Todorovsky).

Noize MC is a musician, rap and rock artist, freestyle performer, author of his own hiphop opera, and an artist signed to Universal Music. Over the past 15 years, Noize MC has become the voice and idol of a generation, thanks to his active public work and strong civic stance. He was featured in the Forbes "50 Stars" list in 2010 and 2019, nominated for "Best Russian Artist" at the MTV Europe Music Awards in 2010 and 2019, and was awarded the Colta.ru "Hero of the Decade" title in 2019. His album "Not all there," released this spring 2025, is considered one of the most significant milestones in his career. In 2025, Noize MC was nominated for the Nobel Peace Prize for his organization of the charitable project Voices of Peace. https://www.instagram.com/noizemc/

Timur Sadyq began their hairstyling career in Eastern Europe and is now based in New York City. With over 15 years of experience, drawing on a rich European foundation and the dynamic energy of NYC, Timur brings a distinctive and refined perspective to the world of beauty. Their work seamlessly blends classic European aesthetics with contemporary trends, resulting in striking looks across stage, screen, and print. Timur's editorial hairstyling has been featured in leading fashion publications including Cosmopolitan, L'Officiel, InStyle, and Cosmo Beauty. They have collaborated with major fashion houses such as Ulyana Sergeenko, H&M, Dior, and Dolce & Gabbana, as well as beauty brands like Redken, IT Cosmetics, Maybelline NYC, and NIKE. In the realm of film and theater, Timur has brought characters to life through thoughtful and expressive hair design. They have worked as a hairstylist on various film productions in New York and have also designed hair and makeup for multiple theatrical productions, contributing to the storytelling through visual transformation and period-accurate detail.

Sam Saliba is a Lighting Designer originally hailing from Boulder, Colorado. With a passion for storytelling and creating captivating experiences, Sam has helped bring to life a variety of shows from traditional Plays, Musicals, and Dance to Concerts, Nightlife, Film, and Immersive Theater. Recently he has designed for *Moonrise* at Paradise Club, Jungle, Bob Moses, and Ludacris.

Kristina K (Kharlashkina) is an accomplished fashion and costume designer with over a decade of expertise in design and concept development, textile innovation and embroidery. A graduate of the Royal Academy of Fine Arts in Antwerp, she has designed for iconic brands such as Carolina Herrera, Valentino, Monique Lhuillier, Tom Ford and more. Kristina's designs have graced red carpets and global stages, including custom creations for Kamala Harris, Jill Biden, and Maye Musk. As the founder of her brand Kristina K and a runner-up on *Project Runway* Season 19, she combines visionary artistry with technical mastery, with her work featured in ELLE, Vogue, Harper's Bazaar, and L'Officiel.

Brian H. Scott is a Lighting Designer based in New York City, recently designed *The Handmaids Tale* with Anne Bogart and Boston Lyric Opera, *the theatre is a blank page* with SITI Company and Ann Hamilton and *Lost In The Stars* for LA Chamber Orchestra, *Falling and Loving* with Elizabeth Streb and SITI Company as well as a number of projects with Kronos Quartet. He created lighting for *Tears become...Streams become*, *Bound to Hurt* and *Neck of the Woods* with artist Douglas Gordon. With Ann Hamilton habitus, *The Event Of A Thread*. Alexander Shishkin-Hokusai (b. 1969, Leningrad, USSR). In 1995 graduated from Leningrad Institute of theatre, music and cinematography. Since 1998 – member of Russian Union of Artists. Works as a theatre artist, creates paintings, installations and performances. His works are characterized by absurdity and surrealism, a discrepancy between the external and the internal.

Dan Safer is the Artistic Director of dance/theater company Witness Relocation and has directed/ choreographed their shows all over the place, from the back rooms of bars in NYC to Théâtre National de Chaillot in Paris to a giant leaky warehouse in Poland where a light fell off the grid halfway thru a show and almost killed him. WR is a resident company at La MaMa. Dan's recent choreography includes Hoi Polloi's production of Family by Celine Song; Jedermann starring Lars Eidinger at the Salzburg Festival; direction/ choreography for Chuck Mee's Aristotle Thinks Again with Great Jones Rep. He got kicked out of high school for a year, used to be a go-go dancer, and once choreographed the Queen of Thailand's Birthday Party. Dan is a Senior Lecturer and Director of Dance Programs at MIT.

Olga Akueva is passionate about supporting young talents by giving them a platform for development and helping them maintain their creative practice. Her broad experience within the legal industry and foreign service, her organizational talents and dedication to high standards of execution positioned her ideally within Alexander Molochnikov's team as the key production professional and the COO of Molochlandya Inc. Olga brings a unique combination of business acumen, creative sensibility and empathy.

Mariia Kovalenko worked as an Assistant Director for the workshops of *Seagull: True Story* over the two years of its development under the direction of Alexander Molochnikov. Her dedication and collaborative spirit played a vital role in the project's

evolution, contributing to the workshops' creative atmosphere and the production's overall success. Mariia's passion for theater made her an invaluable part of the team throughout this journey.

Anastasia Gudkova is an arts producer and program coordinator based in New York, currently serving as Producer at MART Foundation. She has been involved in the co-production of projects such as *Autodance* by Sharon Eyal, *Summer Snow* by Ella Rothschild with the Batsheva Dance Company, and the Off-Broadway productions of *Our Class* and *The Merchant of Venice*. Anastasia was the lead producer of Gibney Company's first international tour in Israel and their European debut in the Netherlands. As of 2024, she also holds the role of Associate Producer at Gibney Company.
