Martita Abril (Pichu) is an artist, curator, and producer from the border city of Tijuana. México. She has collaborated with dance artists and companies including Lux Boreal, Kim Brandt, Yanira Castro, Yoshiko Chuma, Milka Djordevich, Tess Dworman, Devynn Emory, Daria Fain and Robert Kocik, Lily Gold, Allyson Green, Abigail Levine, Mina Nishimura, Cori Olinghouse, Okwui Okpokwasili & Peter Born, Will Rawls, David Thompson, Larissa Velez-Jackson, and Cathy Weis. Martita was a performer in Simone Forti's Dance Constructions, the Handles exhibition by Haegue Yang and most recently the Mirrors I & II piece by Joan Jonas at the Museum of Modern Art. She is a Fresh Tracks Residency alumni, part of the Dance and Process (DAP) artist in residency program at The Kitchen, and she is currently in The Movement Research (MR) Artist-in-Residence Program, funded, in part, by Mertz Gilmore Foundation. She also continues to guide workshops in Bushwick gardens to Spanish speaking familias who recently arrived to NYC, through the iLAND (Interdisciplinary Laboratory for Art Nature and Dance) program by Jennifer Monson. Martita co-curates In/Between, the annual immigrant artist group exhibition at New York Live Arts in partnership with NYFA's Immigrant Artist Mentoring Program originally created in 2019 by Yanira Castro, Martita, and Poppy DeltaDawn. She is currently the Director of MR at the Judson Church Program, the Trisha Brown Dance Company's Tour Company Manager, and continues to mentor Immigrant artists as part of the NYFA Coaching program.

Blaze Ferrer is an interdisciplinary performer and choreographer interested in the mainstreaming of queerness within the American capitalist hegemony. Blaze makes experiences that express the vibrancy and limits of embodiment through post-Judson choreographic scores and the incorporation of consumerist cultural iconography. As a lead artist, Blaze has made work for Pioneers Go East, Pageant, The Collapsable Hole, Prelude Festival, The Brick Theater, The Exponential Festival, Movement Research@Judson Church, Sundays on Broadway, New Dance Alliance, AUNTS, danceh0l0, Brooklyn Arts Exchange (NEEDING IT), HERE, Dixon Place, and various DIY events. Blaze has performed for and helped generate pieces with Stacy Lynn Smith, Yanira Castro, Jeff Aaron Bryant, Nora Sorena Casey + Christopher Dennison, The Drunkard's Wife, Radiohole, Ursula Eagly, Londs Reuter, Ilan Bachrach & Robert M. **Arantxa Araujo** is a queer Mexicana and dynamic performance artist whose work blends her background in neuroscience with cultural production and organization. Rooted in feminist ideologies and bio-behavioral research, her art manifests as meditative, multisensory experiences that promote awareness, personal growth, and societal change. Araujo utilizes the metaphor of a neuron's physiology, drawing from diverse influences, including dance, philosophy, and somatic practices, to create multiform outputs in video, photography, sculpture, and installation. Her work addresses themes of identity, immigration, and community from a queer immigrant feminist perspective, challenging societal norms and advocating for diverse expressions. Araujo's art has been showcased at notable venues such as the Brooklyn Museum, the Queens Museum, Ex Teresa Arte Actual in Mexico City, and international festivals including Nuit Blanche in Saskatoon, Canada.
