

DIRECTOR'S NOTE:

What archive could ever carry a complete genealogical map—one that traces the lineage of traits, codes, and lessons handed down through generations? While researching Sophia's nomadic Kalmyk heritage, we found documents directly tied to her family reaching back as far as the mid-1800s. But then they stopped, and the archival record became general, detached.

What remains when paper and oral archives only tell part of a story? We explore this question by building an improvised archive: a body that remembers what the file cabinet forgot. Slipping between personal memoir, collective myth, and somatic memory, each shift seeks to expose the tension between permanence and flight, borders and movement, home and corporeality, self and community.

Those Who Remained widens that excavation to a communal wound—the genocidal removal of the Kalmyk people. It is a living rupture that still reverberates, reminding us that severance is not metaphor but felt reality. In a moment when genocidal erasure is ever present, we must ask: what does it mean to be cut away from one's own future?

Such experiences resemble surgical resection: not total erasure, but the slicing out of vital life, leaving craters and demanding we lean into our bodily wisdom.

As you engage in *Those Who Remained*, I welcome you to lean into your body, and open the channel to something unexpected— to the sensation that memory is not static, that loss is not final, that survival is an act of creation.

Sophia Gutchinov (actor, writer, executive producer) is an award-winning multiethnic multidisciplinary artist, actress, performance artist, comedian, model, and voice over artist based in NYC. She was found by La MaMa, while giving her AAPI Equality Speech in 2021, featured on NBC Channel 4. Soon thereafter, she started her artistic residency at La MaMa. And her autobiographical story, Those Who Remained was born! Sophia can be seen and heard in: Minute Maid, Walmart, Adore Me, Nathan's, and Lancôme commercials. She is in a Marvel production alongside Method Man and AnnaSophia Robb. She stars in How to NY, a comedic web series, under the production company, The Tadpoles, with she co-wrote and co-directed with Lauren E. Butler. Her mixed media collage won the 1st Salamander International Art Award in Paris, France at the Monteoliveto Gallery. She graduated in the top 10 of her class at Marymount Manhattan College with a BFA in Acting and Minor in Neuroscience. She teaches webinars on the business of acting. She has been interviewed in Backstage (print and digital) and Casting Networks, giving advice for aspiring actors and on her acting career. She creates art that sparks a conversation, has a message, and makes you laugh, for social change and healing. Sophia has made various performance art that addresses democracy, the Statue of Liberty, racial equality, and being a woman. This project was born out of the animals guiding her, her dreams, her journals, her meditations, living a nomadic life, staying open to divinity and opportunity, and manifesting with God and the Universe. 
