

THE MOBY DICK BLUES

A Working-Class Opera-for our planet...for our times.



Playwright Michael Gorman's epic new opera **The Moby Dick Blues** begs the question "What was Ahab, but an addict, really, and what was Moby Dick but an allusion to opium, and heroin, its contemporary scourge?"

The past and future collide in a tale that stretches across generations and ancients-lost mariners, lost souls, lost lives-in this iconoclastic working-class blues-rock opera about a New England fishing community's daunting quest for survival and transformation in the face of the opiate crisis.

When a troubled young sea captain cuts a Faustian bargain with a fisherman turned drug dealer, The Moby Dick Blues catapults us down to "the crossroads" where delusion becomes reality and livelihoods and traditions are tested in a high-stakes battle for the soul of a community.

Topical and bold, the opera calls for a reevaluation of Ahab's vengeful obsession with the White Whale, and our own destructive relationship with nature, the environment and ourselves.

PLAYWRIGHT/PRODUCER



Michael Gorman (Playwright/Producer/Experimental Theater Artist/Advocate) Michael Gorman and his production company–THE FORTY HOUR CLUB—are long-time residents of La MaMa Experimental Theater Club, where Mike has a long-standing history and has produced many of his plays over the past 25 years. As an artist, advocate, and tradesman, Gorman embraces the collaborative spirit of the job-site to tackle major

issues and bring an authentic working-world perspective to the stage. His work focuses on the social, environmental, economic, and systemic challenges facing working communities, and the paramount issue of sustainability. Through his art & advocacy theatrical model—"Chasing The New White Whale—Harpooning Addiction", and through his work with the addiction/recovery and reentry communities, Gorman has been able to directly address the opioid crisis taking place in fishing and working communities in his home State of Maine, and beyond. His latest epic work—"The Moby Dick Blues"—is the product of a seven-year developmental journey deep into the heart of the opiate epidemic in rural New England by the playwright and his production company—The Forty Hour Club.

DIRECTOR



Joe John Battista (Director & lead Guitar) is an acclaimed Director who has been involved in over 100 plays and musicals. Joe is also the Artistic Director of the historic 13th Street Repertory Theater in New York City. He is a graduate of the American Academy NYC, and is an actor and a member of Actors Equity and the Dramatist Guild. An accomplished musician, Joe was lead guitarist for the bands, Razor Engine, Electric Landlady, and appeared

and played blues in "Lone Star!". Joe previously directed (and played guitar) in Michael Gorman's: Never Leaving This Boat (2021); The Ahab Inside Me (2022); and The Ahab Inside Me–Redux (2023), and has been instrumental in the musical development of THE MOBY DICK

PRODUCER



Donna Daly (Producer/Creative/Production Manager) is the co-director of THE FORTY HOUR CLUB, where she is a collaborator, producer, and a creative force behind the development of the company's theatrical productions and projects, including THE MOBY DICK BLUES. Donna is also a co-creator of The Forty Hour Club's art & advocacy project—"Chasing The New White Whale—

Harpooning Addiction"— a theatrical and performance "Arts Intervention" model that addresses the opioid crisis taking place in fishing and working communities. She recently codirected and co-produced (with Michael Gorman) the documentary film "A Phantom Song"—a companion piece to The Moby Dick Blues about The Forty Hour Club's work with members of the addiction/recovery and reentry community in Maine.

ARTIST STATEMENT



"In 1998, my oldest brother Kevin, a beloved New England commercial fisherman, died of a heroin overdose. The tragic event had a profound effect on me. It wounded me. And like Ahab, who lost his leg to the great White Whale, I instinctively sought revenge. I started chasing the 'New White Whale' of opiate addiction that was destroying the lives of so many working people, families and communities across America, like my own. I became obsessed with the opioid epidemic and the idea of invisibility-that there are people among us, that feel, for all intents and purposes, invisible. That there are real 'Phantoms' among us.

But much to my surprise, I discovered that the whale was innocent. And most consequentially, I realized that I had a major theatrical work on my hands, capable of changing the destructive myth of Moby Dick, while giving voice to those living in the shadows of the opiate epidemic—all with the exciting potential to land on a major stage".

A graduate of The Saint Petersburg State Institute of Performing Arts and The Lee Strasberg Theatre & Film Institute, NY, he has over 50 credits in theatre, film and TV series in Europe and the US. Roles include Netflix, HBO, Amazon Prime and FX TV series: The Americans, Madam Secretary, The Punisher, Gravesend. Off Broadway projects: The Singing Windmills, Greengard-The New Musical, Raskolnikov and the Pawnbroker, Chekhov, Williams and Devil knows What, Shift of Opinion. Alex is also a renowned voice talent in feature and animated films produced by Disney, 20th Century Fox, Warner Bros, and other Hollywood studios. His credits as stage director and filmmaker include numerous European and New York productions. Alex also teaches Method Acting and Stage Directing at the Lee Strasberg Theatre & Film Institute. COLLABORATING ARTISTS



Gregory De La Haba is an American interdisciplinary artist, writer, curator, and cultural producer. A skilled painter with a pedagogical lineage that stretches back to Jacques Louis Davide, he is an exemplary practitioner of fine art whose conceptual practice resists categorization.
