ABOUT THE ARTISTS:

Celine Song (Playwright) is an Academy Award-nominated screenwriter and filmmaker whose signature blend of emotional depth, intelligence, and humor has established her as an essential voice in today's entertainment landscape.

Most recently, Song presents her highly anticipated sophomore feature, *Materialists*, which released internationally on June 13 through A24 and Sony Pictures. Written, directed, and produced by Song, the film follows Lucy (Dakota Johnson), a young, ambitious New York City matchmaker torn between the perfect match (Pedro Pascal) and her imperfect ex (Chris Evans).

Released by A24 in Summer 2023 following its world premiere at the Sundance Film Festival, Song's feature debut *Past Lives* has received widespread critical acclaim. The film earned Academy Award® nominations for Best Original Screenplay and Best Picture, alongside numerous other honors including the Directors Guild Award for Outstanding Directorial Achievement in First-Time Feature Film, Best Feature Film at the 2023 Gotham Awards, the Film Independent Spirit Award for both Best Picture and Best Director, as well as Golden Globe®, Critics' Choice, and BAFTA nominations.

As a playwright, Song is best known for *Endlings*, which premiered in 2019 at American Repertory Theater and had its New York debut in 2020 at New York Theatre Workshop. She has been a finalist for the Susan Smith Blackburn Prize and a semifinalist for the American Playwriting Foundation's Relentless Award. During New York Theatre Workshop's virtual 2020 season, she presented live on Twitch, *The Seagull On The Sims 4*. Song also wrote on the first season of Amazon series *The Wheel Of Time*.

Alec Duffy (Director/Scenic Design) is a playwright and director, and the founder of both Hoi Polloi and the Brooklyn performance venue JACK. He has created many original works with Hoi Polloi, including Winning is Winning, White on White, Dysphoria, The Less We Talk, and All Hands. In 2010, he shared an OBIE Award for Three Pianos, a paean to Schubert's Winterreise song cycle, co-written and performed with Dave Malloy and Rick Burkhardt in a production directed by Rachel Chavkin that toured to New York Theatre Workshop and American Repertory Theater after its premiere at Incubator Arts Project. In addition to his work with Hoi Polloi, he directed acclaimed productions of T.S. Eliot's Murder in the Cathedral at The Cathedral of St. Joseph in Brooklyn, and the English-language premiere of Yukio Shiba's Our Planet at Japan Society. His production of Moto Osada's opera Four Nights of Dream premiered at Japan Society in 2017 and toured to the Tokyo Bunka Kaikan. Duffy studied at L'École Internationale de Théâtre Jacques Lecoq and is a Drama League Directing Fellow.

Steven Leffue (Composer/Sound Designer) is a West Coast-based sound designer, saxophonist, and computer musician. A long-time collaborator with Hoi Polloi, his work is a synthesis of musical intuition, experimentation, and auditory immersion. Steven is a co-founder of JACK (Brooklyn), Americas Director for the International Computer Music Association, and Director of the University Theatre at University of California, Riverside.

Dan Safer (Choreographer) With Hoi Polloi, Safer has choreographed Winning is Winning, Family, All Hands and made a fake folk dance for Three Pianos. He is the Artistic Director of dance/theater company Witness Relocation (www.witnessrelocation.org) and has directed/ choreographed their productions all over the place, from the back rooms of bars in NYC to Théâtre National de Chaillot in Paris to a giant leaky warehouse in Poland where a light fell off the grid halfway thru a show and almost killed him. Recent projects include Jedermann starring Lars Eidinger at the Salzburg Festival in Austria and direction/ choreography for Chuck Mee's Aristotle Thinks Again with Great Jones Rep. Upcoming look for Spider Rabbit with Tony Torn at La MaMa next Spring and co-creating/ performing a new duet with Tommy DeFrantz, somewhere at some point in the next year or two. He used to be a gogo dancer, once choreographed the Queen of Thailand's birthday party, and got kicked out of high school. Dan is a Senior Lecturer and the Director of Dance at MIT.

Kate McGee (Lighting Design) is a trans lighting designer, new media artist, and deviser of theater works. She is currently in the midst of a years long world tour as Lighting Designer for Esperanza Spalding and off brand gods dance. Recent Off Broadway - Bowl EP (Vineyard Theater), The Beastiary (Ars Nova), I'm Revolting (Atlantic Theater Company), Snatch Adams, and Notes on Killing (Soho Rep), The Hang (Here Arts). She was a 2022/2023 artist in residence at Soho Rep where she developed the VR piece Girl Mode since seen at Fabric Arts Workshop and the ASU's MIX Center. Kate made several pieces with Peter Mills Weiss and Julia Mounsey that have been seen in NYC and Europe.

Luis Feliciano (David) is an actor-director who focuses on the physical theatre traditions of Clown, Bouffon, and Commedia dell'Arte. He has completed a year-long Clown Teaching apprenticeship with Christopher Bayes (Head of Physical Acting @ Yale) and worked as Studio Manager for Clown Gym's 10th Season. He devised and performed in *Flock the Vote* at the 2024 Atlanta Fringe alongside master *bouffon* Eric Davis. He has performed and taught Commedia dell' Arte with the Department of Fools, a Commedia troupe that ensemble-devises their material, seen most recently at The PIT. He was also a Co-founder and Resident Actor of Torch Ensemble, a theatre company that mounted a 5-star run in Edinburgh Fringe 2023, won BEST PLAY at NYC Fringe 2024, and made their Off-Broadway debut shortly after at Playhouse 46.

Hoi Polloi (Co-Producer) is an OBIE-winning New York-based collaborative theater company formed in 2007 by director Alec Duffy. The company uses the transformative power of theater to upend conventions and bring about a more imaginative society.
