


ELIZABETH MARVEL. (A Lawyer) Broadway: King Lear, Picnic,

Red Line, Minority Report, Lincoln, Nightmare Alley, Syriana, Fantastic Four, Holes, Donnie Brasco, Just Mercy, The Incredible Hulk, The Sound and the Fury, As I Lay Dying, Meet the Fockers, Captain America: Brave New World, and Guillermo del Toro's Pinocchio. For television, he starred in HBO's Watchmen opposite Regina King, earning a Critics' Choice Award nomination; and more recently in Peacock's Emmy-nominated Poker Face and Guillermo del Toro's Cabinet of Curiosities. As a filmmaker, he has written and directed five features, including Leaves of Grass starring Edward Norton, Keri Russell, Richard Dreyfuss, and Susan Sarandon; Anesthesia starring Sam Waterston, Kristen Stewart, Glenn Close, Gretchen Mol, and Corey Stoll; O, a modern adaptation of Othello starring Mekhi Phifer, Josh Hartnett, and Julia Stiles, The Grey Zone, starring Harvey Keitel, Mira Sorvino and Steve Buscemi, and Eye of God, with Martha Plmpton, Hal Holbrook and Richard Jenkins. This fall Nelson plays a supporting role in FX's new drama series The Lowdown starring Ethan Hawke and created by Sterlin Harjo. He also appears in Mona Fastvold's highly anticipated musical drama feature film The Testament of Ann Lee, starring Amanda Seyfried. Currently he can be seen in the title role of the independent feature, Bang Bang, playing an aging boxer whose glory days are long past. He is currently editing his latest film as a writer/director, The Life and Deaths of Wilson Shedd, starring Amanda Seyfried, Scoot McNairy, Wunmi Mosaku, Missi Pyle, and Nelson himself. He published his debut novel, City of Blows in 2023 with Unnamed Press, and will debut his second novel, Superhero, in December of this year. He is a graduate of Brown University and Juilliard.

MARK WING-DAVEY (Director) lives in NYC and is an Arts Professor in Grad Acting at NYU's Tisch School of the Arts where from 2008-2020 he was chair. He first came to prominence in the U.S. for his production of Caryl Churchill's *Mad Forest* at New York Theatre Workshop (with Tim Blake Nelson in the original cast), initiating his U.S. directing career and earning him an Obie Award for Outstanding Director.
